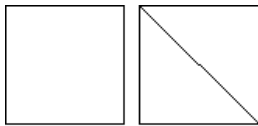


Tulip Basket

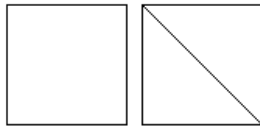
Block measures 12 1/2 " high by 12 1/2 " wide Unfinished



Cut 1 piece at 5 5/8 Inch Square and then subcut this into 2 triangles. You will be using only 1 of the triangles for this block.



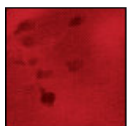
Cut 2 pieces 5 1/4 in. High by 7 3/4 in. Wide



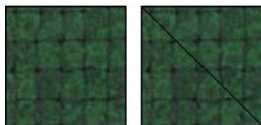
Cut 2 squares that are 3 1/4" and then subcut these into 4 triangles



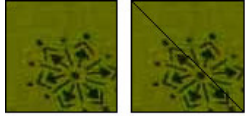
Cut 1 square that is 2 7/8"



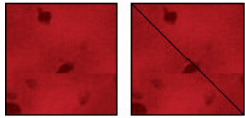
Cut 1 square 2 7/8"



Cut 1 square that is 5 5/8" and then subcut this into 2 triangles

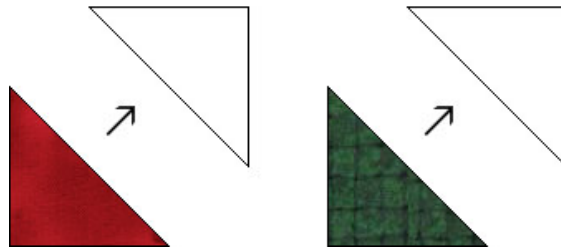


Cut 2 squares that are 3 1/4" and then subcut these into 4 triangles



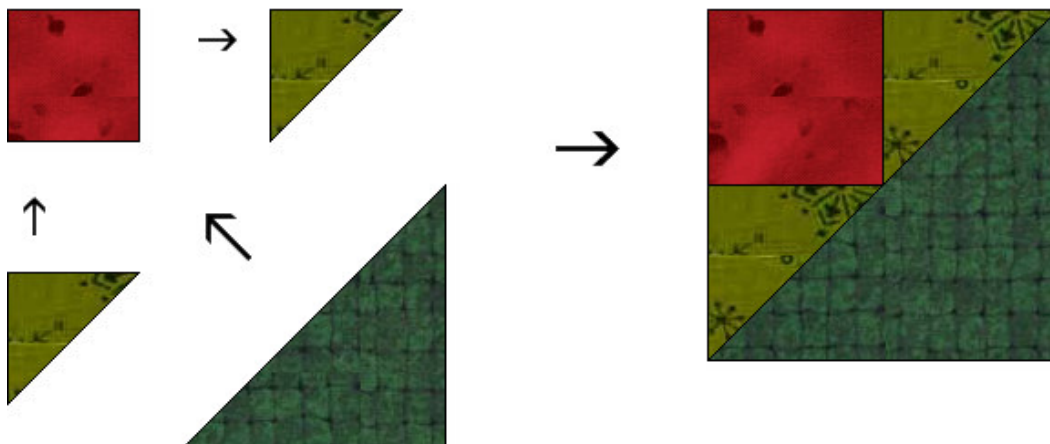
Cut 1 square that is 3 1/4" and then subcut this into 2 triangles

Using a 1/4" seam, sew all your half square triangles together and press to the darker side.



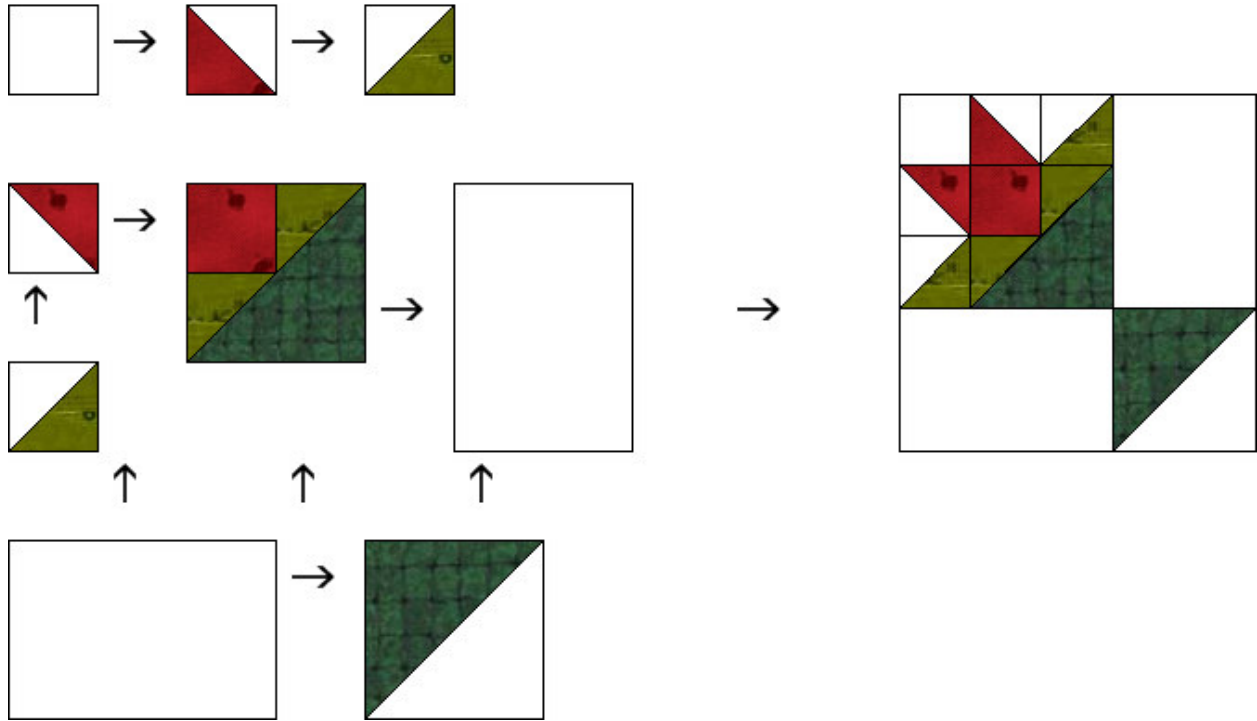
Using a 1/4 inch seam allowance, sew the green triangles to the red square, Press gently this is cut on the bias!

Next sew the bigger green triangle to the bottom making a square unit as shown.



Lay out your pieces as shown and using a 1/4" seam allowance sew your block together using the picture as your guide!

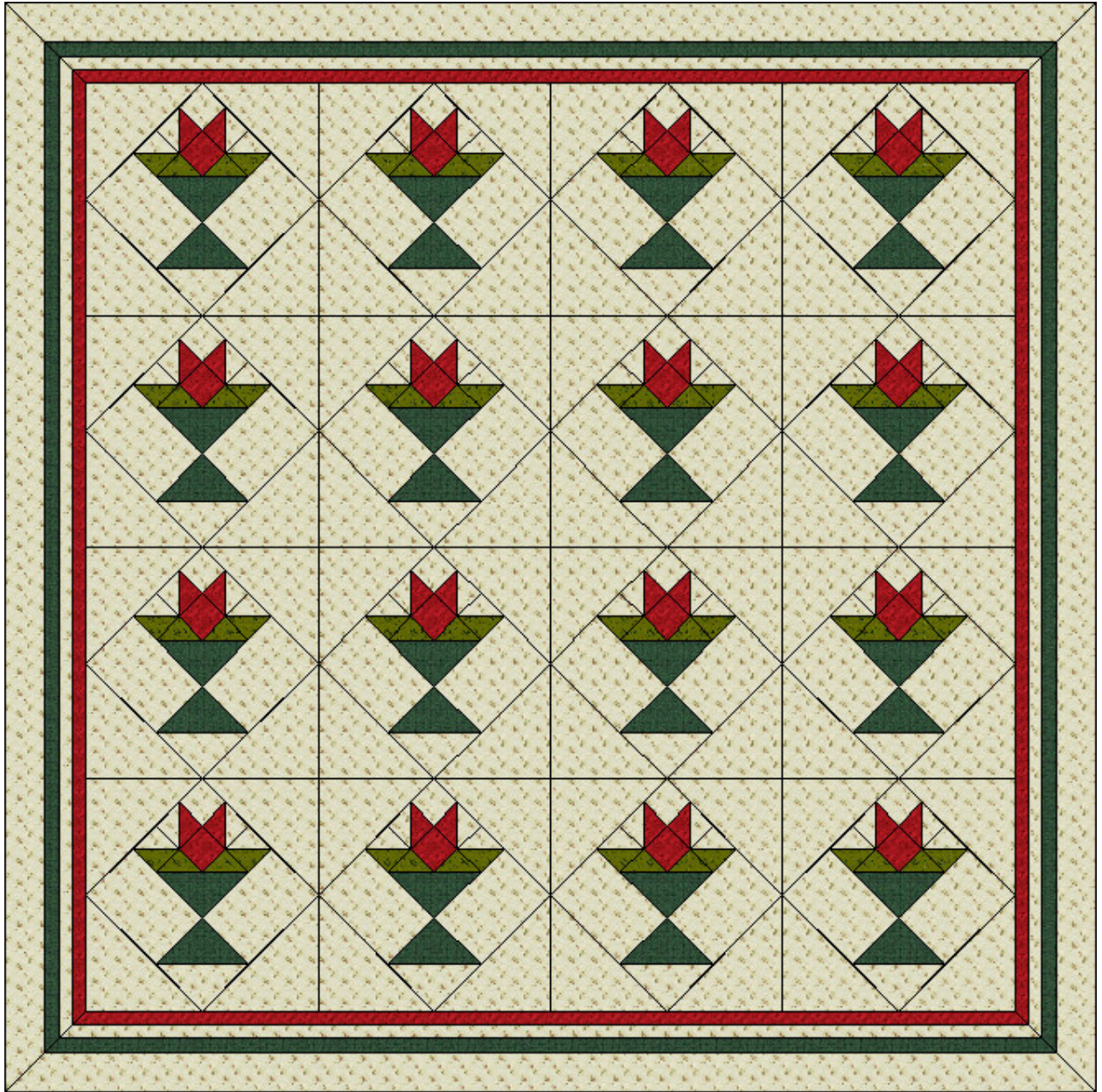
Your block should measure 12 1/2" unfinished!



Below see an example of how this block would look done up in a quilt, block on point. This quilt measures 80" by 80"

The formula for the setting triangles for this quilt is:

For the 12" finished block you will cut a square $18 \frac{1}{4}$ ", Cut each square twice on the diagonal to make 4 triangles. You will need to do this for every block in your quilt.



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
